It's September which means Labor Day and an opportunity to develop our student's background knowledge on the importance of honoring American workers and unions. Have you thought about using vocabulary in sustaining your students' ability to comprehend what they read and remember key facts? Researchers have found that it takes between 8-10 exposures to learn new words in a deep and meaningful way (Center for Applied Linguistics, 2016).

Think about implementing learning stations for your multi-level class. One group can complete the Labor Day vocabulary worksheet, while another group can work on building a story with 5 words. For your pre-literate students, develop a picture bank with 6 words and create a grid with a number on each box.
