

Adult Education Disability Documentation

INSTRUCTIONS FOR PRACTITIONERS

[*Student's Name*] has requested a disability accommodation to participate fully in Adult Education.

Guidelines of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) require documentation from a practitioner knowledgeable in the field of the student's disability and knowledgeable of this specific student's disability-related limitations to have accommodations considered. The student above identified you as the practitioner who can provide this information.

The Documentation **MUST** include:

- Current diagnosis.
- Major life activities impacted by the diagnosis raise it to a disability.

The Documentation **MAY** include:

- Suggestions for accommodations to remediate the disability-related difficulties anticipated in the Adult Education setting.

You may use your letterhead, or the form attached to provide this information and send it to [*Disability Contact Person Name*], Disability Contact Professional for [*Agency Name*] program at [*Disability Contact Person Email*]. When the completed documentation is received, it will be reviewed, and if necessary accommodations for the student's disability-related needs in this specific Adult Education program will be granted.
