Let's Celebrate Voting Day and Citizenship! 👑



November 7 is election day and why not use this day to discuss the importance of Citizenship in your classrooms by developing their functional reading skills? These are skills that require adult readers to use specific reading strategies such as looking for clues and generating questions (Hock and Mellard, 2005). These reading comprehension skills are aligned with the new CASAS reading assessment. For more information on this article, look at the multiple-hours section.



In 10 minutes...

Discuss voting and the right to vote by sharing the amendments that were used to guide the changes on **ELCivics.com**. Additional resources for civics classrooms are linked on the page. Allow students time to discuss in groups what voting rights are and how they are the same/different in their home countries. Finally, provide students with a graphic organizer to compare U.S. voting rights with those in their home countries.

In 30 minutes...

Try the Change Agent's Call to Action - Issue 59 to share stories of Citizenship and action from students like themselves. Additionally, develop your students' functional reading skills by using pre/post-discussion questions to target key skills in their reading and or listening. Try to use articles that include audio, to develop your students' listening comprehension skills which are considered a precursor to reading comprehension. Finally, allow students multiple opportunities to interact with the text/audio by reading with a partner, on their own, and in a whole class routine.
